Overall, the class should show competency across the board. Rubric is used.</p> <p>Schedule/Cycle (hide or delete after migration): Faculty teaching Basket Weaving 210 will meet every other January (after the fall semester) and compare notes on how well students did on the final as it relates to these questions. Assessment Method	Assessment Result (What We Learned)
<p>Assessment Method: Review samples of the four kinds of basket construction, using a rubric that rates samples on accuracy of weave patterns, consistency of work, and ability to accurately describe each construction method in writing.</p> <p>Assessment Method Status: Active</p> <p>Target: 80% of students should be able to score an overall score of "well" or "very well" on at least three patterns. 95% of students should achieve an overall score of at least "fair" on all patterns. Scores for each of the four patterns will also be tracked and targets established.</p> <p>Schedule/Cycle (hide or delete after migration): The department's undergraduate curriculum committee will collect 8 examples of each of the four kinds of basket construction. Samples of student work from the course BASKET WEAVING 200 will be taken every other spring and be reviewed over the summer. (This will be done every other year starting in summer 2010.</p> <p>Related Documents: BASKET WEAVING RUBRIC.docx</p>	<p>RESULT DATA</p> <p>Academic Year of Assessment Results: 2023 - 2024</p> <p>Assessment Result (what we learned): Four faculty from the curriculum committee reviewed samples of student work that was submitted with their portfolio. Overall, 25 students were reviewed. 94% of students score very well or well on at least three patterns. However, we noticed that there could be improvement in the accuracy of weave patterns. While acceptable, faculty wanted this improved.</p> <p>ANALYSIS OF ASSESSMENT RESULTS</p> <p>Describe and explain what these data demonstrate about student learning.: The program, overall, is doing well. Students are meeting the overall goals. The rubric enabled faculty to focus on the need for one area of improvement - weave patterns.</p> <p>Data Conclusion: Target met or exceeded</p> <p>CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT</p> <p>Describe how you will use these findings and the analysis to improve the program.: A subset of the undergraduate curriculum committee is meeting this fall to discuss how to achieve better accuracy of weave patterns.
